Like the sculptor, the painter, the poet, he is driven by creative compulsion. But he, more than any of the others, is caught up in the race against time. The sculptor works in stone; his mistakes can be changed by the chisel. The breeder works with flesh; his mistakes may take generations to correct. The sculptor can put his work away and eventually come back to it; the breeder is a captive of his breed and can never really leave it.

Why then does a breeder stay a breeder? The answer is that of all the activities in the dog sport, he alone has the joy of creation and the pride of enduring handiwork!

When proud owners bring back a fine animal for him to see years after it was sold by

him as a puppy, he notes with a thrill how it has developed in just the way he thought it would. While they are happily telling him what a marvelous creature this is he is scarcely listening as he stares at the dog; for he is not only seeing what they are, but so much more.

With mounting excitement. he watches that

imperious stance, so familiar, that proudly arched neck and the keen steady gaze right out of the past; he does not see just ONE handsome dog standing there before him, but all the wonderful ones which went into the making of this one - dogs which he loved and knew so well...and now sees living again. This is the fascination of the breeder. This is the treasure of eternal youth! &




hen you are in the ring and the judge is ready to make the final selection hearing the fateful words "Take them around one more time" invokes feelings of excitement and anticipation. That is what we hoped for when we selected the theme "ONE MORE TIME" for the 86th Afghan Hound National Specialty. The beautiful logo, designed and drawn by Mary Ann Giordano, was also intended to invoke those same feelings. We hope we succeeded and everyone who participated had a memorable experience.

The 86th Afghan Hound National Specialty began on Tuesday October 17, 2023, with LGRA Racing and Fast CAT on the grounds of the Roberts Centre in Wilmington, Ohio, and concluded on Saturday October 21, 2023, with Best of Breed Judging and the Annual Awards dinner. It was followed on Sunday October 22nd with two regional specialty shows held by the Detroit and Chicago clubs.

In the middle of those events, we enjoyed AKC and AFSA Lure coursing on Wednesday, Obedience, Rally, Agility and Sweeps Judging on Thursday, Dog and Bitch Judging on Friday, with Jr. Handling preceding BOB Judging on Saturday.

This was a compressed schedule that reduced the days devoted to conformation judging by one day. Also, Sweeps was held Thursday evening after companion events and in combination with a welcome/vendor party including heavy hors d'oeuvres. Junior handling was scheduled on Saturday with hopes that it would



encourage more participation. The result was six Junior entries more than in recent memory at a National. These changes were inspired by member feedback asking for a shorter National. If you like/or do not like this format it is important that you provide feedback to the Board of Directors as they consider these and other proposed changes.

Our Judges did an outstanding job at every event and so did our exhibitors. There were no incidents and the mistakes made by the Chairs were accepted with the spirit of good sportsmanship that is characterized by the Afghan Hound Club of America members.

As Chairs we have more thanks to give than we have room for in this publication but some of our helpers deserve special recognition. Beth Collins and Sue Hamlin for an outstanding effort in fund raising. Erica Jantos for always being ready to

help and to make sure we knew about the unknown issues that we had not considered. Sue Busby for all the advice and stepping in to take charge of procuring all the ribbons. Susan Weatherhead for all the selfless help during the entire event. Helen Stein for making sure we did the little things that made the event a success. Leslie Stoffels, Ken Amos, and Linda Shipley for putting on what may be the most successful Art Auction in National history!

Finally, to our daughter Rachel Howard who seemed to be everywhere doing whatever was needed whenever it was needed.

We can't thank everyone enough; it does take a village and as usual the Afghan Hound Club of America membership stepped up to the task.

Agility Critique

It was a my pleasure judging your Afghan Hounds in agility at your National this year.

The experience of witnessing the intersection between grace, agility, and handler patience in the Afghan world was impressive.

Here are some observations based on their performance:

Aesthetic Beauty in

Motion: Afghan Hounds, with their long, flowing coats and regal stature, create a striking visual spectacle on the agility course.

Their movements are characterized by a certain ethereal quality, turning each run into a graceful performance. The contrast between their elegant appearance and the dynamic agility required in the sport adds a layer of fascination.

Surprising Agility: Despite their aristocratic demeanor, these hounds demonstrate a surprising level of agility.

Their slender build and long limbs enable them to navigate through the agility course with unexpected speed and dexterity. It's intriguing to witness how their physical attributes - often associated with a more sedate lifestyle translate into an ability to tackle the challenges of the course with finesse.

The handlers, experienced and novice, had the intelligence and the pride to navigate the course with the love of being a teammate with their four-legged family member.

Interplay of Independence and Collaboration: The Afghan Hound's independent nature is evident in their approach to the agility course. However, there's also a visible interplay of collaboration, especially in well-trained houndhandler pairs. The moments of synchronization between handler cues and the hound's response showcase the potential for a harmonious partnership.

Variable Energy Levels: Afghan Hounds exhibit

bursts of energy, often seen in short sprints or bursts of enthusiasm during some of the agility runs. However, maintaining a consistent level of energy throughout the entire course was a challenge. It's interesting to observe how handlers manage and channel their hounds' energy to ensure a steady and focused performance. I was told by some to be prepared for some to have the ZOOMIES, but they were all controlled.

Handler-Hound

Bond: The agility course offers a platform for observing the bond between Afghan Hounds and their handlers.

In successful partnerships, there's a seamless communication between the two, with handlers providing cues and guidance that the hounds respond to with agility and enthusiasm.

In summary, observing Afghan Hounds in agility is a captivating experience that goes beyond the typical expectations associated with this breed. The blend of elegance, surprising agility, and the challenges posed by their unique characteristics contributes to a distinctive and memorable presence on the agility course.
