The exhibit hall is a 15,000 square foot building just across the driveway from the hotel. The grooming area will be adjacent to the show ring, with bathing facilities - sponsored by Laser Lites - just outside the building, canopied and fenced. A fenced and canopied exercise pen on grass will also be provided.

Food concession and full-service bar will be open during show hours in the exhibit hall. FREE morning coffee will be available for early-birds.

Flying In

Portland International Airport (PDX) is serviced by all major airlines, most using aircraft that will accept 400 and 500 size crates - take note that Alaska Airlines has a flat \$100 pet baggage fee. Schedule of Events

WEDNESDAY - September 25

ASFA & AKC Lure Trials will start our National events on Wednesday morning in a lovely community park only 10 miles from the hotel. The site offers a mowed grass field with both natural boundaries and safety fencing, paved parking and indoor restrooms. The ASFA trial will start at 8 AM, followed promptly by the AKC trial which will include Qualifying Courser and two Junior Courser tests. Best in Event will immediately follow the AKC trial.

Agility Trial will be scheduled in the afternoon, after lure coursing, at a fairgrounds facility just 15 miles up the freeway from the hotel or the coursing grounds. This indoor packed-dirt arena is regularly used for area agility trials, and provides enough space for two rings. This gives us the opportunity to offer Fast Classes this year, and will also help reduce down time between the classes.

Grooming Area will be available to the public at 1:00 PM. Any exhibitors who assist with show building set-up will be allowed to have 'first pick' in the grooming area.

Vendor Welcome Party will start festivities in the exhibit hall in the early evening, with free hors d'oeuvres and full-service no-host bar.

Senior Showmanship Competition will also be held in the exhibit hall on Wednesday evening. This free event is open to exhibitors who will admit they are at least 40 years old, and will be judged by our best Northwest junior or graduate handlers. Costumes, retro dress, show dress or kennel clothes are equally welcome in the ring.

THURSDAY - September 26

Obedience and Rally Trials will begin the Thursday events - with the same judge as the 1989 National held at this same location. The Obedience Trial offers all the new AKC Optional Titling classes; these include Pre-Novice and Beginner Novice (which are all on-lead exercises) all the way up to Pre-Utility and Versatility.

FIRST EVER at the National 4-6 Mo. Beginner Puppy Competition will start the show events on a sweet note!

Veteran Sweepstakes will trot into the ring right after the newest generation, to be followed by **Triathalon Conformation** and regular **Sweepstakes**.

Breed Symposium and dinner will be held in the hotel ballroom. Dr. Paul Scherlie will discuss "Inheritable Eye Diseases in the Afghan Hound".

FRIDAY - September 27

Dog Classes and Bitch Classes will both be judged on Friday.

Parade of Rescue will be held during the break between the sexes.
