LEGISLATIVE REPORT Submitted by Legislative Chairman Betty Salmon

This will be my first report as your Club's Legislative Chairman. I would like to thank the Board for placing their trust in me, and pledge to do my best to represent your interests as Parent Club members. It's been a little busy around here since I accepted the position in late February. The animal rights activists are happy to see their onerous legislation considered in 34 states this session alone.

I have prepared several general position statements for the Board to consider endorsing. This action will give us, as a club, the ability to use our numbers when battling anti-breeder legislation in the state houses. Each statement is deliberately inclusive, to allow for agreement and a united front.

Additionally, I've formed a coalition comprised of national breed clubs, state and national associations/federations of dog owners, and agricultural concerns to coordinate efforts to combat the onslaught of anti-breeder legislation at the state level and prepare for the national battle to come. This coalition utilizes a contact person for each organization and the legislative alerts/talking points (provided by the AKC) to inform our respective members and activate volunteers in each state as needed. By launching grass-roots efforts to inform communities and legislators of the issues involved and people/businesses/ voters and rights impacted by these onerous animalactivist backed bills, we hope to fight this fight in the most cost-effective and successful manner possible.

I've had good conversations with a staffer in DC (responsible for animal-related legislative affairs) and an individual with AKC legislative affairs, and have received follow up information from the DC staffer to help us stay current with regard to certain pending legislation. If you have a legislative contact that you wish to share, please do!

If any of you are interested in helping with this effort by writing letters to legislators or newspapers, making calls or distributing flyers when called upon, please let me know. And if you are aware of an organization that may be interested in lending their numbers and support to this coalition, please contact them on our behalf or refer the contact information to me.

Whew! Yep, it's been a busy month.

DELEGATE'S REPORT Money Makes the World Go Around Submitted by Connie Butherus, Delegate for the AHCA to the AKC

"Vote Early and Often"

The annual meeting of the AKC Delegates held Tuesday, March 10, 2009, was also the annual election. With eight individuals running for the four available positions on the Board of Directors, the "often" word was operative. It took four separate ballots to get the job done. More on that later.

As always we started our quarterly sessions with the Committee meetings on Monday. I attended the Parent Club meeting and am a member of that Delegate committee. The agenda included:

<u>Group Realignment</u> (also discussed at the Annual meeting on Tuesday)

Issues regarding Dock and Crop and the procedures for certain breeds

Code of Ethics project undertaken with all Parent Clubs

<u>Parent Club Conference</u> – scheduled for Summer 2010. The AKC will provide substantial financial support and a registration fee will be required for attendees. The Parent Club Committee will have to come up with an additional funding of \$66,000. Date and location yet to be determined. Each Parent Club to send one representative.

<u>2009 AKC Eukanuba Show</u> 125th Anniversary. All Parent Clubs are requested to participate (response to Michael Canalizo) by June 1 2009. All breed event with classes – not by invitation only as in the past. Parent Clubs can offer either a Specialty or Supported event and Meet the Breeds.

<u>Local Breed Clubs'</u> ability to conduct business by email – depends on State regulation – one size does not fit all. <u>AKC will supply "rewards"</u> – free giveaways – for all exhibitors at National Specialty shows – contact Dave Roberts at AKC.

<u>Canine Health Foundation</u> – Donor Advised Fund letter to all Parent Clubs – quarterly report will be sent to all clubs in the future – IRS codes for 501-c3 (Tax Exempt) organizations – money must be spent and not merely sit and draw interest – also once donated the donation is irrevocable. Last year some outstanding grants were unfunded due to participating Parent Clubs refusal to release their funds to support the work. The total in the Donor Advised funds is about \$3,000,000, 2/3 of the total is from Parent Club Partnership Program donated by Purina and not from the individual Parent Clubs.

OFA, CHIC and DNA Parentage-DNA-numbers can now be linked.

Then onto the Delegate Caucus to close out the day.

The eight delegates running for the AKC Board presented themselves at an open – from the floor – question and answer session. The topics ranged from the inclusion of mixed breed issue to AKC declining registrations, AKC finances, AKC marketing, AKC brand, AKC public relations, AKC rules, AKC, AKC, AKC, etc. etc.

Not sure many of the delegates had a change of mind (vote). Unless one of the candidates really hit a home run or totally strikes out it seems that seldom do the Delegates have a change of heart at that late date.

Tuesday – March 10 - Election Day. As the Delegates arrived, picked up required ID badges, electronically signed in (new wrinkle), got a cup of coffee, found a seat, we were greeted by all eight of the candidates circulating about the venue. They were gracious, all smiles, wonderfully turned out and your new best friend! Kidding aside these candidates – all eight – are intelligent, dedicated and truly have the best interests of dogs and the AKC at heart. As with all elections – choices must be made. We are often told "Elections have Consequences." But we were unable to predict the consequences of this election – replacing a third of the existing Board. Alas we are mere humans.

It took four ballots to sort out the four winners with three having been elected on the first go around. By the fourth ballot only two of the remaining five were in the running.

Results were:

Lee Arnold – 195 votes, first ballot Carl Ashbey – 253 votes, first ballot Alan Kalter – 290 votes, first ballot Bob Smith – 229 votes, fourth ballot.

Delegate's Report continued

The balance of the meeting consisted of the following:

- Two votes on Beagle Field Trial Rules (actually opposed by the Beagle Parent Club but supported by the Beagle Advisory Committee of the AKC) both passed!
- Three new member clubs admitted Harrier Club of America Norfolk Terrier Club of America Northern Florida Armature Retriever Club
- President's Address included concerns regarding the current economy but stressed the AKC will survive noting a gain of \$25M in the past five years.
- Staff promotions Dave Roberts to V/P title
- Staff Recognitions for outstanding service
 - Bobby Birdsong Events Darrell Hayes – Judging Operations

Paula Spector – Conference and Events Planning. Paula having worked at the AKC for 38 years is one of the true heroes of the operation!

• Awards for significant contributions and service to the sport of pure bred dogs

- Connie Vanacore Louis Auslander
- Nelson Sills
- Financial Report by Treasurer Jim Stevens. The annual report is out and available. In spite of all the doom and gloom in the economy the AKC had a \$3M profit in operations in 2008 with a loss of 31% of market value (investments) which is now back to the 2003 level. Of special interest it was reported (as required) the total expenses for the

AKC Board of Directors (12 directors) was \$128,809 for 12 two-day meetings per year plus other required travel/events.

AKC Delegates (609 delegates) was \$640,806 for 4 one-day meetings per year. The average attendance per meeting was approximately 300 (AKC Annual Report). This reporting is not required but was included – per-haps for purposes of comparison.

(Based on the provided numbers, a quick calculation shows \$25,567.41 per AKC Board member — who are also delegates - incurred cost to the AKC and \$2,136.02 per Delegate based on about 300 attending per meeting. The Delegates are provided one set of morning refreshments and lunch but must pay for everything else – hotel, food, travel etc. etc. I am not sure what all is included as actual expense to the AKC such as related Staff expenses for travel, lodging and/or salaries, meeting room, post show reception in CA etc, but I know for sure I could not possibly have eaten \$2,126.02 in food in the 4 meeting days ((lunch and morning coffee)). I am also not sure whether the 12 Board members' – Delegates all – expenses paid by the AKC are included only with the Board expenditure, or are part of those specified for the Delegates.)

- Group Realignment report to the Delegate body by the Committee chair Tom Davies. Proposal is to go from 7 to 10 groups with the following proposed group changes:
 - 1, Sporting Group divided
 - a. Pointers and Setters
 - b. Retrievers and Spaniels
 - 2. Hound Group divided
 - a. Scent Hounds
 - b. Sight Hounds
 - 3. Additional Group Northern Group

4. Nonsporting Group no longer exists but rather a Companion Group including all three varieties of poodles.

Afghan Hounds will of course be in the Sighthound Group. This group will consist of:

The proposed realignment will be read at the June Delegate meeting with a vote to be taken at the September meeting. I will vote as directed by the AHCA Board.

Questions arose regarding the proposal and the cost to the AKC to accomplish this, effects on existing group clubs, impact on small all breed clubs, and the status of current Nonsporting Group judges. We were told that judges affected by the changes will have until 2014 to become approved for the additional breeds in the groups. The proposed effective date for the realignment – if approved - is 1/1/12. More to follow on this issue to be sure.

Mixed Breed Issue – Once again the Delegates were asked to show support for mixed breeds having standalone events for performance – Obedience, Agility, CGC type events. This generated the usual pro and con discussion regarding the mission, charter and bylaws of the AKC. President Sprung requested staff to have a model for consideration drawn up by April. A straw poll of the Delegates still able to stand at the end of the day indicated support for the concept – once again.

Next meeting is June 8 & 9, 2009, in Raleigh, NC.

We are proud to announce the GTCAHC is now licensed to hold AKC Lure Coursing events. Through the generosity of local Afghan Hound enthusiast, Nate Wattenhofer, owner of King's Ranch, our events will be held on a groomed field that is entirely fenced, located in Ramsey, Minnesota. King's Ranch has a magnificent clubhouse where lunches and/or dinners will be served.

The dates of our first events are June 19 and 20, 2009, with 3 JC tests, two all-breed trials and an Afghan Hound specialty trial. In addition to the lure coursing, the Cambridge, Minnesota and Anoka County Kennel Clubs are hosting four days of all-breed conformation shows on June 18 through the 21st. These all-breed shows are about 45 minutes from our lure coursing site. More information on the Cambridge and Anoka shows can be found at the superintendent's web site <u>www.onofrio.com</u>.

Our next all-breed lure coursing event will be held at the same location, King's Ranch, on August 20, 2009, the day prior to our Specialty Show. The day after our specialty show, on Saturday, August 22, in the afternoon, we will be hosting an Afghan Hound specialty lure coursing trial and test, followed by a party for our guests. 
